In 1984, our beautiful, 25-room Ronald McDonald House opened its doors, providing 770 nights of respite to families during our first year. Now at 84 rooms, we served 22,115 nights in 2024 alone. Over the past 40 years, we've served nearly 57,000 families when they needed us most.

We are proud to say that while we may look different than we did 40 years ago, our commitment to our mission to keep families together and promote the health and well-being of children has never changed. In addition to physically expanding our House over the years, we have enhanced our meal program, added amenities to support caregivers and grown our mission to help families facing mental and behavioral health concerns feel welcomed and free of stigma.

Looking ahead to the next 40 years, we remain grateful to all of those who stood before us to build this beautiful House and committed to holding tight to our mission, serving our future families in the most impactful ways possible.



Where Do Our Families Come From?



Shane's Story

Shane's family spent 295 nights at our Ronald McDonald House.



Baby Shane was admitted to Children's Wisconsin on May 11, 2024, due to complications from feeding. While his mom, Alicia, was producing enough milk, doctors thought the milk was lacking the fat needed for Shane to gain weight. She expected a short stay – just long enough to work with a lactation consultant and gain the information needed to help Shane thrive.



Days turned to weeks. The care team tried different types of formula and even a Nasogastric (NG) Tube – a thin, flexible feeding tube inserted through the nose, down the throat and into the stomach – to try and get Shane the nutrients he needed, but his condition remained the same.



The doctors continued to change formulas, run various tests: ultrasounds, endoscopies, other procedures, and there was still not a direct answer as to why Shane needed extra help to gain weight. Eventually, he began receiving the nutrients he needed to thrive via a central venous catheter that delivered a Total Parenteral Nutrition solution of carbohydrates and lipids. Around that time, Shane weighed in at exactly 16 pounds. He was still on the smaller side – about 16 pounds shy of where he should have been for his age.


Throughout this journey, Alicia was appreciative of the resources our Ronald McDonald House was able to provide for her and her family – meals, toiletries, laundry facilities and more. Most importantly, though, the House made it possible for Alicia to keep Shane's brothers and sisters with her while also focusing on Shane's health.

"I'm just extremely grateful and always will be for everything that the House has done for us. I know Shane will continue to need medical care, so knowing that RMHC will show support of our family no matter what is something that I will always be thankful for."


Donor Spotlight: The Dyble. Stephens, Dorsey & Gentine Families





The Lepper Family

Brooke Lepper was diagnosed with B-cell acute lymphoblastic leukemia at 17 years old. When her cancer had progressed and chemotherapy alone was not working, she was told that she would need to travel from Stevens Point to Milwaukee to receive a bone marrow transplant.

The thought of her and her parents having to pack up their lives and move over two and a half hours for a couple months scared her, until she was introduced to the Ronald McDonald House. Thanks to the House, Brooke's family was able to stay close to her while she received treatment at Children's Wisconsin and they still visit for follow-up appointments. The family has called our House "home" for 114 nights to date.

On average, our families stay a little over a week. In 2024, 68 families stayed for 60 days or more.

We suggest a \$20 per night donation, but families are never required to make a financial contribution towards their stay. In 2024, families paid it forward with **\$108,216** in room donations.

84 guest rooms keep families together and close to partner hospitals throughout their children's treatment, with Tempur-Pedic® beds, private bathrooms and other comfortable amenities.



In 2024. **1,771 guests** received social and emotional support as they shared cuddles and playtime with our four-legged friends during **200 hours** of Pet Therapy.

Our House is much more than a place to sleep. It is a community of support that provides therapeutic programming, healthy meals and comfortable living spaces for the entire family to enjoy.



1,872 guests enjoyed **152 sessions** of magic shows, character visits, music and dance performances, story readings, virtual reality and more.

In addition, **508 guests** attended **80 sessions** of Therapeutic Programming, including martial arts, music therapies and art therapies in 2024.



Supported entirely by generous donors and filled floor to ceiling with toys, gift cards, stuffed animals and books, the Magic Room is one of the most special spaces in our House.

In 2024 there were an estimated **3,673 Magic Room visits,** making stays brighter for guests 21 and younger.
